AWWA Florida landmark upgraded

CH2M HILL and CH2M HILL
Constructors, Inc. are putting the
finishing touches on a Florida
drinking water landmark by
upgrading the Hillsborough River
Water Treatment Plant to 100 million
gallons per day capacity.

Startup is proceeding ahead of schedule with formal dedication planned in January.

First put into service by the City of Tampa in 1925, the plant previously operated at a capacity of 80 mgd.

The latest \$49 million upgrade to the

plant expands treatment capacity by 25 percent and incorporates new ozone disinfection and high-rate flocculation and sedimentation technology.

Designated an American
Water Works Association
landmark, the Hillsborough River
plant treats raw water from the
Hillsborough River Reservoir to
provide drinking water to the
450,000 water users of the Tampa
Water Department.
