



Mission Accomplished: CH2M HILL employee receives NASA award

CH2M HILL employee Jason Glasgow was awarded NASA's Space Flight Awareness Honoree Award for his work at the Marshall Space Flight Center.

The award was presented to 33 flight center employees and contractors at a ceremony in August. Located in Huntsville, Ala., the flight center is one of 13 National Aeronautics and Space Administration installations nationwide and is the lead center for developing propulsion technology. Glasgow works onsite at the Marshall center providing project management and engineering assistance for NASA's Superfund and environmental sustainability programs.

"The entire CH2M HILL team has gone over and beyond the call of duty since we began working with NASA," Glasgow said. "This is a team award as far as I am concerned."
