


CH2M HILL Alumni Association Legacy Gift Fund, Inc 2026 Board of Directors

Rick Luebbers, Director, President



With a B.S. degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Nebraska, and an M.S. degree in Transportation Engineering from Oregon State University, Rick joined CH2M HILL in 1973. He retired in 2014 after 41-year career in planning, design, and management of major transportation projects and programs.

During his career, Rick served in several management positions in CH2M HILL's Transportation Group in Denver and in the Pacific Northwest. As well as delivering projects, he managed business development activities and served as sales manager on major pursuits.

Following retirement, Rick led planning efforts for CH2M HILL's 2015 and 2016 Alumni Reunions and served as an advisor for the 2018 and 2022 reunions. He joined the Board of Directors for the CH2M HILL Alumni Association (CHAA, now doing business as CH2M HILL Legacy Association - CHLA) as the corporation was formed. Rick prepared the first strategic plan for CHLA and served as President for four years. He led the planning program for the new CH2M HILL Legacy Gift Fund (LGF) and now serves as its President.

Mike Mynhier, Director, Vice President

Born in Indiana in 1946, Mike Mynhier attended Purdue University where he obtained his B.S. in Civil Engineering Degree in 1968 and M.S. in Environmental Engineering Degree in 1974. He began his career with Greeley and Hansen Engineers in Chicago in 1968 and then joined CH2M HILL in Reston, VA in 1974.



One of the earliest assignments of his 36-year career with CH2M HILL was working with Gene Suhr on the Potable Water Reuse Feasibility Study for the Denver Water Board. His work also included stints in Milwaukee, WI (1979-83) to work on the Water Pollution Abatement Program for the MMSD; Charlotte, NC (1983-90) where he managed the firm's first office there and also oversaw construction of the McAlpine Creek WWTP; Atlanta, GA (1990-95) in management and client service roles; a temporary assignment to

Miami, FL (1994-96) to work with MDWASD and to manage the Miami office; and back to Atlanta, GA (1996-2010) where he was the Program Manager for the Combined Sewer Overflow Remedial Measures Plan for the City of Atlanta.

In retirement, Mike is an active volunteer including disaster response, mission work in Guatemala and Appalachia, owners-representative project management, and serving at his church. He is also an avid woodworker and enjoys international travel with his wife, Marge.

Scott Trusler, Director, Treasurer

Scott Joined CH2M HILL in 1983 after attending Montana State University and obtaining degrees in Civil Engineering, with focus on hydraulics and water treatment. With all belongings packed in a Ford Pinto, Scott left his hometown in western Montana and



headed for the big city of Seattle, Washington (well Bellevue). Over the course of more than 20 years he focused on water system planning, conveyance, and water treatment projects playing a key role in treatment plants for Hoquiam, Skagit County, Walla Walla, Richland, and Seattle Washington, Arlington, Texas, and Cary/Apex, North Carolina. These projects helped bring high-rate filtration, ozonation, and UV treatment into mainstream use at the time. The Cedar Treatment Facility (Seattle Public Utilities) is memorable as a group of talented and dedicated CH2M'ers from across North America came together to win and deliver the

firm's first, fully integrated Design-Build-Operate project – still delivering water to over 1 million customers after more than 20 years of the operations period.

Trading the wet northwest for the hot, dry southwest, the next home base was the Tempe, Arizona office. By this time, a majority of “work time” was focused on oversight of various operating units including global design resources. Always making time for projects, since “projects pay the bills,” Scott managed the Zone 4 Ion Exchange plant for Glendale, Arizona and assisted on projects whenever possible including value engineering and start-up plan for the one billion gallon-per-day, Catskill-Delaware UV plant for New York City.

With additional duties such as group level risk management, the next move was to Denver with little time available for projects. However, after five years Scott was fortunate to take on the project director role on the Tuas Water Reclamation Plant, spending four years in Singapore working with an amazing team on this once in a lifetime project prior to retirement in January 2021. Now retired and living in the mountains outside Denver, days are spent hiking, biking, traveling, and supporting both CHLA and LGF as Treasurer.

Steve Wanders, Director, Secretary



Born in Boston, Massachusetts, in 1956, Steve attended Purdue University where he earned his BSCE in 1978 and MSCE in 1979. Steve joined CH2 HILL in the Portland office in January 1980 in the Structural Engineering department working on a wide variety of projects including dams, wastewater treatment plants, industrial

buildings, and bridges. He relocated to the Milwaukee office in 1986 as part of the nucleus of the new Transportation business group in the Great Lakes Region. In 1994, Steve and his family moved to Dayton, Ohio, as the Transportation group expanded throughout the eight states in the Midwest region. Through those first 27 years of Steve's career, he served in many roles in project and people management, area management, business development, and operations.

In 2007, as empty-nesters, Steve and his wife, Lori, relocated to Savannah, Georgia, where Steve took on a new role as Global Operations Director of the Ports & Maritime Group and to serve as the Program Manager for work with the Georgia Ports Authority. Steve left CH2M HILL in November 2014 as part of the Voluntary Retirement Program.

In his encore career, Steve returned to his alma mater and ran the Cooperative Education (Co-Op) program at Purdue University in West Lafayette, Indiana. In 2019, Steve and Lori relocated to the Atlanta area; and Steve continued his career in higher education at the University of North Georgia in Dahlonega, working in Employer Relations in the Career Services department.

Since fully retiring in November 2021, Steve has enjoyed playing golf, serving on the Board of Directors and Building & Grounds Committee of his HOA, traveling with Lori, and enjoying time with their five grandchildren.

Kathy Hanna, Director

Kathy joined CH2M HILL in 1998 and perfected the art of leading successful public



involvement and community relations campaigns. Her well-earned skills focused on conflict resolution; assessing and reporting on environmental impacts; developing action plans; and managing projects dealing with municipal waste, hazardous waste, and Superfund sites. Kathy's ability to work with both private and government clients led to her role as Vice President and Sales Manager for the Environmental Services Business Group.

Mike Doleac, Director



Mike graduated from Oregon State University in 1972 with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. He joined CH2M HILL in August of that year in the Bellevue WA office and spent his career there until retiring from a full-time role in 2013. He continued to work part time, serving on Joint Venture boards until 2024.

During his career Mike worked on projects for water and wastewater systems, hydroelectric plants, bridges, ferry terminals, light rail transit line, airports, Olympic facilities, hazardous waste remediation, and many other interesting projects.
